Columbia Goes "Car-Free" This Earth Day

This Earth Day, April 22nd, Columbia will operate free commuter buses from Bergen County, New Jersey and Rockland County, New York to incentivize commuters to choose a cleaner commute option. Studies have identified that many Columbia members residing in these areas have driving commutes. With capacity for over 200 users, this initiative is set to divert over 15 tons of carbon emissions and over 3,200 miles of driving! Columbia University is adopting a set of Sustainability Principles to set forth a high level vision for sustainability for its campus communities in New York and across the globe. A first draft of the Principles has been developed through a partnership between University Facilities and Operations and the Earth Institute, and members of the University community had the opportunity to ask questions and provide feedback on the Principles during informational town hall meetings at the Morningside, Lamont-Doherty and Medical Center campuses. Focus Teams to Create Sustainability Plan

The University has organized focus teams around key sustainability impact areas (transportation, waste and energy/greenhouse gas emission) with the goal of developing a high-level sustainability strategic plan to be released in Spring 2017. These teams are comprised of students, faculty and staff from across the University, with guidance from a newly formed Senior Sustainability Advisory Committee.



Introducing a New Bike-Share Program

Students, faculty and staff can ride around campus and beyond on brand new bikes as part of a new bike-share program through Zagster.. To plan for a thriving future, business leaders need to understand how rising global temperatures can change their investment landscape in the near future. They now have a new resource to expand their knowledge base:



Carman Hall Wins the 2016 Energy Challenge!

Carman Hall has won the 2016 Energy Challenge with a sweeping 10% reduction in kWh, ultimately saving approximately 4,500 kWh throughout the entirety of the challenge! Watt Hall took second place, followed closely by River Hall, in third place. Combined, the buildings saved over 5,200 kWh and diverted over 3,300 lbs. of CO2 from our atmosphere.



Mailman School of Public Health Paper Reduction Green Office Certification Program To Award First Participants


The Mailman School of Public Health has been actively engaged in a paper reduction green office certification program over the past year. In May, Dean Linda Fried will announce the teams who's efforts have earned them the Bronze level of certification. Since this time last year, the school has reduced total paper purchased by 17%, specifically reducing non-recycled paper purchased by 26%. Read more.

Measuring Success





This September, Columbia Print transitioned to 100% recycled-content paper for black and white copies. To date, the department has saved 298 trees, almost 140,000 gallons of water, and diverted over 9,000 lbs. of solid waste from landfill, and over 300,000 lbs. of CO2e from the atmosphere. Looking forward, Columbia Print will begin to transition all University stationary to 100% recycled content paper. Read more.
